

ODE TO A NIGHTINGALE ESSAY

"Keats' poetry captures a sense of intensity, contrast and beauty. How true is this statement of the poems 'Ode to a Nightingale and 'To Autumn'?

Romanticism was a time of unprecedented change when ideas about the power of the imagination came forth, explored by the romantic values of emotion, imagination and idealism. John Keats' illustrates these through his odes, To Autumn and Ode to a Nightingale which successfully capture a sense of intensity, contrast and beauty through the nightingale, a symbol of poetic inspiration, fulfilment and life lifted beyond misery. Ode to a Nightingale is a quintessential representation of beauty and conveys Keats spontaneous imaginary journey as a form of escape from the temporal word. The poem contrasts Keat's perception of reality with the idealised world of the imagination in which he constantly searches for beauty, which is reflected in To Autumn, an ode that personifies Autumn and searches for beauty through nature. It juxtaposes beauty with human nature and accentuates the cycle of life with the personified "death" of autumn. Through each, Keats has captured a sense of intensity, contrast and beauty whilst emphasising his point of escaping the temporal world, shaped by the recurring omnipresent threat of death.

Keats' captures a sense of intensity through his ten-line stanza. Ode to a Nightingale. He longs to escape the temporal world as it is filled with pain, suffering and despair, captured by the long vowel sounds which emphasises his transcendent state. "My heart aches and a drowsy numbness pains my sense." Whilst the nightingale is presented as a real bird, it later becomes a symbol, representing freedom from his world of misery and despair as an escape from his harsh reality.


